3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ The minutes of the Minutes of the AMHA Board meeting held ____ were reviewed. Jerred Bridges made a motion to approve the minutes, Donna Terry seconded the motion and the board unanimously approved the minutes.
4. PRESIDENT'S REPORT ~ Sheryl Peterson gave the President's Report ~ All is going well in the office and we are looking forward to fun and successful regional shows.
5. TREASURER'S REPORT ~ Treasure's Report was presented by Clair Severson ~ please see attached report.
6. OFFICE REPORT ~ Valerie Shingledecker gave the report on Office and Operations. She reported that we have a new CPA for accounting work. The 2027 AMHA World Show judges have been secured and will be announced at the 2026 AMHA World Championship Show.
The office now has a new printer costing approximately \$100 per month.
Val reported that the AMHA received a generous give from a member
The office is preparing to send out Director Elections for Regions 5, 6 and 7. Region 5 has 2 candidates for one position and Region 6 has 4 candidates for 2 positions. Region 7 is uncontested.
7. HUB/COMMITTEE REPORTS are gathered by Jerred Bridges and presented by the committees. Written reports received will be attached at the end of these minutes.
 - a. Halter Futurity Report ~ presented by John Bennett ~ the Halter Futurity Committee is proposing adding 2 Amateur Halter Jackpot Classes to the Futurity Evening. One Standard of Perfection Class and One Stock Type Class. We will vote on this at a future meeting to give members time to look at this proposal.

b. Promotion Committee Report ~Christopher Barnes. There was some discussion about the rules for use of helmets being required for certain events being promoted as fun classes.

c. Amateur/AOTE Committee Report presented by Shanna Crowe. Shanna reports that the Amateur and AOTE classes have sponsors for the 2026 World Show. There will be a "Team Tournament" held at the 2026 World Show. The parameters for this tournament will be decided and presented. Please see written report for further info.

SHOW RULES

Delete entire paragraph and insert the following:

The Show Rules Committee shall consist of eleven (11) Regular members. At each Annual Meeting, the three longest tenured members will rotate off the committee. In the case of more than three members with the same tenure, the Show Rules Committee will vote to determine the members who will rotate off. Three replacements will be elected from the General Membership. The members who rotate off the committee will be eligible to run for the committee again. After the annual meeting the committee will then vote for their committee chair. All committee members must participate in person or by electronic means as long as all members can hear each other simultaneously at the Show Rules Committee meeting held at the Annual Convention, mid-year Board Meeting and the World Championship Show (with the exception of extreme excused absence) in order to be eligible for the committee the following year. Failure to participate in the three meetings will result in dismissal. If a vacancy arises the committee will fill the vacancy by appointment at the discretion of the committee.

Justification: This is the only elected committee that does not have a term limit in effect. All officers, BOD and the LOC have that provision.

This rule is similar to the LOC Rule (LO-42) Page L-10 in the rulebook. This is a way to keep the continuity of the committee year to year the same way LOC has done successfully.

NOTES from Show Rules Committee: The committee did not recommend this. It was voted down unanimously. This could possibly uproot the committee each year (not to mention giving our oldest tenured members an easy way out). The 3-year term has

worked well for our committee, and the membership still votes for 6 members every 3 years.

Note from Co-Chair: As a long-time Show Rules member, I can tell you it takes a long time to get comfortable and knowledgeable in the committee, and especially the Chair position. I still rely on past Chairs and long-time members for history.

Note from Long time LOC and Show Rules member. First I want to point out that Licensed Officials Committee used to retain its members the same way that Show Rules does. The **LOC voluntarily came to the Board** asking to change how they elected members to the committee. **The Members and/or the Board did not come to LOC** asking them to change it. It was a committee decision, unlike what this rule proposal is bringing to Show Rules. LOC chose how best to govern their committee. Therefore, Show Rules should be able to make their own decision on how their committee should operate rather than be forced to change, **particularly when all 11 members are in favor of its present operating model.**

More than any other Committee, decisions made and actions taken by Show Rules can affect the wellbeing of AMHA as Show Rules' decisions on protests can lead to legal action being taken. Knowledge of the Rulebook is paramount and there is a learning curve involved. Knowledge of past practices and how incidents were handled previously is extremely important and because of that having members with longevity on the committee is an advantage.

Our committee is large (11 members), but like most committees there are a few who handle much of the research and paperwork involved (and there is plenty). To lose our experienced members, chairpersons or our main "worker bees" on the Committee because they happen to be the longest tenured members of the committee is not reasonable. You can maintain that they can be voted back on, but what if they are not? Show Rules probably has the biggest workload of any of our committees. There is too much at stake if we end up with inexperienced people heading up Show Rules and making decisions for AMHA.

Last election year, every person but one who ran for Show Rules was voted onto the committee. We had people who were not even present who expressed an interest and got voted on. So the idea that our present system favors people from only one Region as the election for vacancies is every 3 years is incorrect. Elaine Sulser, for example, was voted onto the committee and has never been to an Annual Meeting. Show Rules has committee members from all 3 Regions and 8 different states. Therefore, our current system does not favor any particular Region.

All committees are different and should be able to choose what works best for them. Most of our committees get new members every year, but they are not committees where the members are chosen by the membership. In the Finance Committee, for example, the chairperson can choose or refuse members who volunteer for that committee. LOC and Show Rules has members chosen by the members so they retain

members longer. Again, it's just another committee that functions in its own way. Each committee should have the right to determine how their committee functions best.

Weanlings must not exceed 30 **29** inches

*Reasoning by submitter(s): Many 30" weanlings that are under 8 months old of age are likely to go over 34" at maturity. The junior show heights are meant to keep out horses who are likely to outgrow their AMHA papers from showing. All weanlings at the World Show are 8 and a half months or younger when measuring opens (meaning if a weanling show horse measures 30" they are expected to mature between 34" and 38" give or take depending on their age and percentage of growth. 29" is more reflective of AMHA and the true under horse.

**Show Rules was not in favor of this proposal. There are horses that measured 30" as weanlings, at Worlds, that matured at 32 ½ senior horses (measured at Worlds, with permanent cards).

***Office Impact: This rule change, if passed, will incur cost to the Association to change the current show program software. It will have repercussions on the Honor Roll as well. There is also potential for litigation when our allowed height for weanlings elsewhere is 30.00:.

Replace entire paragraph with:

1. All senior stallions are required to present an Official AMHA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection of Stallion certifying that a licensed veterinarian has examined the stallion and said stallion has been found to have two testicles normally descended in the scrotum to show management prior to showing in an AMHA-approved show. Official AMHA forms for inspection are to be supplied by the AMHA office. Cryptorchidism or monorchidism in senior stallions refers to stallions three (3) years of age or older with one or both testicles not normally descended into the scrotum. Undescended testicles will not be checked for or penalized in horses under three (3) years of age. Certificate of inspection for cryptorchidism and monorchidism must be on file with the show manager. A horse that does not have a form on file or the horse is found to not have two testicles normally descended into the scrotum will be disqualified. EXCEPTION: Any senior stallion that has had a testicle removed due to illness or injury and can provide AMHA veterinary documentation signed by the veterinarian for the reason for the procedure and an accompanying invoice. These documents need to be reported to AMHA and show management prior to the horse being shown.

OR OPTION 2

Replace entire paragraph with:

1. All senior stallions are required to present an Official AMHA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection of Stallion certifying that a licensed veterinarian has examined the stallion and said stallion has been found to have two testicles normally descended in the scrotum to show management prior to showing in an AMHA-approved show. Official AMHA forms for inspection are to be supplied by the AMHA office. Cryptorchidism or monorchidism in senior stallions refers to stallions three (3) years of age or older with one or both testicles not normally descended into the scrotum. Undescended testicles will not be checked for or penalized in horses under three (3) years of age. Certificate of inspection for cryptorchidism and monorchidism must be on file with the show manager. A horse that does not have a form on file or the horse is found to not have two testicles normally descended into the scrotum will be disqualified.

c. AOTE youth mentoring program.

The AOTE youth mentoring program would allow youth to be mentored by an AOTE with a declared AOTE horse without losing it's AOTE status. The intent of this program is to get youth involved with AMHA horses who may not otherwise get involved.

An AOTE may mentor a youth non-related with an AOTE horse.

The AOTE would have to declare the youth and horse(s) by submitting an YOTE youth mentoring form (see fee schedule) to the office before the youth is able to handle the AOTE horse in any way that would normally disqualify an AOTE horse. Form should be sent in with entries to each show entered.

Any youth submitted by an AOTE on the mentoring form can ONLY show horses owned by that AOTE or AOTE Family (as described in AM-010-6-a) or owned or leased (see lease rules) by: the youth, either individually or jointly, the family (mother, father, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, legal guardian, grandparent, step-parents, step-siblings, and step-grandparents) or family-owned corporation, ranch or farm.

4. A declared youth may be removed from the AOTE youth mentoring program by submitting the AOTE mentoring Opt-Out Declaration form to the AMHA Office. The AOTE youth mentoring Opt-Out Form must be on file with the Office prior to the youth showing any horse other than

listed in AM-010-6-i.

The Opt-Out Declaration will not be accepted during the course of any show.

Rationale from Submitter(s) Benefits/encourages attendance at Local Club Shows.

We have Switched to a one (1) Judge Regional Championship show, you shouldn't be able to qualify with a one judge/one show for World Show. For Folks who currently use the old Regional show rule to qualify for World Show, they can attend an additional show to qualify for World show or utilize the Pay to Play system. Restores the requirement that a horse must show at 2 AMHA shows to qualify for World Show

**This will require folks to go to Regionals plus a local club (benefits local club shows) or*

**utilize Pay to Play to pay for one, or both qualifying shows (benefits local clubs through Pay to Play pot money) or *attend 2 local club shows to qualify for World Show (benefits local clubs).*

*******comments from Show Rules meeting from Laura Mullin***

First, having managed the AMHA Regional Shows for 20+ years, I can assure you that there are not a large number of horses at Regionals who have not already attended a local show. The vast majority of people serious enough about showing to attend the World Show have already shown them locally, particularly performance horses. Therefore, allowing a horse to show at

Regionals without going to a local show is not having a significant impact on local show turnout. I am firmly against this proposal.

Secondly, I dispute the argument that it is cheaper to do Pay-2-Play than to attend Regionals. Maybe if your horse is with a trainer, that could be so. But if you are showing your own horses, particularly more than one, it is more reasonable to go to a Regional event than to pay Pay-2-Play on each and every horse.

But here are some of the reasons I have come up against over the years as to why being able to show at Regionals without a qualifying show is important.

1. The Regional events are on tenuous financial footing. They need every possible entry. When exhibitors enter Regionals, AMHA receives income. When they do Pay-2-Play, AMHA gets no income as the money is divided up amongst the clubs. As a former member of the Finance Committee, I know that revenue for AMHA is a priority.

*2. There are **36 states** in the United States that **DO NOT EVEN HAVE A LOCAL SHOW**. **Only 14 States and Canada** even offer a local show. **Five** of those states only offer **one** local show. **One third** of the shows are in **Texas and Oklahoma**. Many states do not have a local show in an adjoining state. So finding **2** local shows to qualify at makes it even more difficult. If the person can haul to a Regional event, they must Top 10 in every class they want to participate in at World, but at least they can qualify in one location. And qualification is not automatic. The most popular classes (obstacle, hunter, liberty, stock, driving, etc.) have more than 10 horses and the people are taking a chance on not getting qualified. But if they don't qualify, at least they can get Pay-2-Play at half price.*

3. Many local shows only offer, for example, Youth Halter Mares, Youth Halter Geldings or Youth Classic Pleasure Driving, and a family has more than one child. They will haul to Regionals where all the age breakdowns are offered so that each child has a chance to qualify for the World Show or qualify with additional horses. Also we have instances where a youth may not be ready to drive their horse at the one and only local show (or the horse may not be ready), but later in the summer they have gained experience. In order to show at World, their only option may be qualification at Regionals.

4. Some people purchase a horse after their local show has already taken place and would like to have a way to qualify that horse for World. For example, Arizona's only shows were April 3 &

5. If any horses were purchased after that date, they would have to go to Regionals or do Pay-to-Play or not go to World at all.

6. Sometimes a horse that an exhibitor has shown all season long is injured and the exhibitor needs to qualify a different horse for the World Show. Under our old rules, they could ask for a hardship, but now their only option is Regionals or Pay-2-Play.

7. Sometimes an exhibitor has health issues that cause them to miss opportunities to show at a local show. Again, they used to be able to ask for hardship under special circumstances, but now it's either go to Regionals or Pay-2-Play.

8. *Being able to receive a measurement slip on Senior horses is very important to our members, particularly those hauling to TX from long distances. If the Regionals are not profitable and have to be discontinued, those measurement slips will no longer be available to the membership. Every entry counts.*

9. *Some people cannot make their local show because of major events (graduation, weddings, reunions), so Regionals offers them a chance to qualify. Often youth who are on sports teams have very strict attendance requirements. If their local show happens before the sports season is over, they cannot attend their local show. Regionals is their only qualification option.*

10. *Why find a reason to exclude horses from our Regional events? ASPC/AMHR doesn't require going to one local show in order to go to one of their Area Shows.*

Section 193A, new #3-5

Add #3-5 to 193A

3. Temporary Hardship of Junior horses for SHOW PURPOSES ONLY, yearlings and 2-year-olds, weanlings are excluded from eligibility. Junior horses shall be eligible for Temporary Hardship after their actual birthdate of current calendar year. Yearlings must meet the height requirement not to exceed 32.00", 2-year-olds must not exceed 33.00". NO BREEDING RIGHTS SHALL BE PASSED TO TEMPORARY HARDSHIP HORSES. No offspring resulting from the breeding of TEMPORARY HARDSHIP horses (or any horse prior to obtaining Permanent Hardship status) will be eligible for regular or Progeny Hardship registration and must independently follow regular Hardship guidelines to obtain registration.

4. Junior horses will be required to pay all Hardship fees per current fee schedule and must follow all standard Hardship guidelines before being granted Temporary Hardship status. Each Temporary Hardship registration certificate will be stamped and recorded as "TEMPORARY JUNIOR HARDSHIP FOR SHOW PURPOSES ONLY". Each horse must be measured to show throughout their Junior eligibility (up to actual 3rd birthdate). Horses MUST be re-inspected, measured and undergo additional DNA testing (stallions and mares) AFTER actual 3rd birthdate to retain Hardship status and be granted "Permanent Hardship Registration". These horses must meet height requirement not to exceed 34.00", have Senior

Veterinary inspections documented and pay Temporary to Permanent registration fee prior to obtaining official papers. No Senior horse will be eligible to show on Temporary Hardship papers after its 3rd birthdate, with the exception of a non-championship show at which they successfully pass re-inspection. No senior horses will be eligible for Championship shows until all Permanent Hardship requirements are met (including DNA results).

5. After Permanent Hardship status is obtained, all normal registration privileges, including breeding, shall be granted and resulting offspring in the years following shall be eligible for regular or Progeny Hardship. Any horse NOT meeting the height requirement for Permanent status upon inspection after 3rd birthday will have registration papers revoked and NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN. Awards obtained during Temporary Hardship status will not be stripped.
